U.S. To Suspend Travel from Europe for 30 Days

Last night the U.S. government banned travel for 30 days for any foreign national that has visited any country within the Schengen Area “at any point during the 14 days prior to their scheduled arrival to the United States.” This suspension goes into effect this Friday at midnight.
